MISSION

Mariposa Family Learning Center provides high-quality, nurturing, and comprehensive early childhood care and supportive family programming, regardless of a family's ability to pay.

IMPACT HIGHLIGHTS

Mariposa Family Learning Center (MFLC) has made a significant impact on our community in 2024, providing essential early childhood education and support to families. MFLC remains committed to creating a nurturing environment where children and families can grow and thrive.

Impact Highlights: This year, MFLC served 17 families and 20 children, offering a personalized and enriching experience. With 2,784 attendance days and 22,512 attendance hours, the center provided a safe, engaging space for young learners.

Nutrition and wellness were key priorities, with 5,500 morning and afternoon snacks provided to ensure children were fueled for learning and play. Outdoor education also played a vital role, with 68 hours spent in the garden. These hands-on experiences connected children and families to nature while fostering curiosity and teamwork.

Promoting early literacy through the Growing Readers program, MFLC distributed **64** new books this year, helping families build home libraries and encouraging a lifelong love for reading.

MFLC's impactful work was made possible through funding from the TLLC Foundation and the TWIB Foundation, which supported the continuation of vital programs that strengthen families and enrich children's lives.

Through its dedicated efforts, Mariposa Family Learning Center remains a source of hope and opportunity, empowering families and helping shape a brighter, more connected future for our community.

FINANCIAL OVERVIEW

Mariposa Family Learning Center has experienced significant growth in recent years as it has expanded its programs and services post-pandemic. The organization has consistently increased its operating budget year-over-year, reflecting both growing enrollment and the desire to invest in its staff, particularly in areas like salaries and the hiring of key personnel.

Key Takeaways from MFLC's Financial Growth and Budgeting Trends:

- 1. Significant Budget Increases:
 - **2022 Operating Budget:** \$380,000 A substantial increase from 2021, driven by the opening of an infant care room.
 - 2023 Operating Budget: \$465,000 Again, a significant jump, reflecting increased enrollment in the infant care room and expanded programming.
 - 2024 Operating Budget: \$547,000 The trend of growth continues, largely attributed to a significant salary increase for caregiving staff and the planned hire of a full-time development director for fundraising and marketing purposes.

2. Efficient Budget Management:

- Despite these large increases in budget, MFLC has been able to manage its finances efficiently. In both 2022 and 2023, the organization spent nearly 10% less than its budgeted amounts, showcasing a pattern of spending below budget.
- **2024 Projections:** Even with the larger budget, it is projected that actual spending will be about 12% below the approved budget for the year, primarily due to the deferral of hiring the full-time development director.

3. Payroll and Staffing Costs as Primary Budget Drivers:

- Payroll, Benefits, and Related Costs: These accounted for the largest portion of the 2024 budget (73%, or nearly \$400,000). This is in line with the organization's goal to better compensate its caregiving staff in recognition of their role in providing high-quality child care.
- Hiring of Development Director: Although budgeted for in 2024, the position of full-time development director has been deferred until early 2025.

4. Other Key Operating Expenses:


- Independent Contractors: Budgeted at \$66,000 (12% of the overall budget) for services like accounting, bookkeeping, and fundraising support.
- Facilities and Equipment Maintenance: \$32,000 (6% of the overall budget), including costs for maintenance, insurance, and upkeep.
- Other Operating Costs: \$39,000 (7% of the budget), covering provisions for children's meals and snacks, teaching supplies, and childcare supplies.

In summary, MFLC has demonstrated financial prudence while aggressively expanding its services. The organization's ability to operate below budget, especially in the face of increased expenditures, shows strong fiscal management. Careful attention will need continue to be given to balancing continued growth, staff compensation, and investment in key roles like the development director to ensure long-term sustainability.



- Graduation: three MFLC children moved on to pre-k and kindergarten this summer
- We established the **Mariposa Sanctuary** in memory of MFLC's own Adryana Aldeen and launched a monthly giving campaign in celebration of her lasting impact on the organization
- Mariposa enters its **5 Year Anniversary** of providing exceptional, accessible childcare in the Montopolis neighborhood of East Austin
- Continuing Education: two of our teachers completed the first year of their three year-long training with Texas School Ready
- MFLC engaged in **effective advocacy** to support the passing of Travis County Proposition A in November 2024 to expand quality childcare access to meet the needs of more families in Travis County

"My son has needed some early intervention support and i had the choice to send him to a facility where they would provide the support or have the therapist provide services at Mariposa. The staff was very welcoming and supportive of helping him get the services he needed. Not only were they supportive of him, but they kept an eye on him to ensure that the therapy aligned with our shared values. Very soon after he started therapy the staff quickly noticed some stress response behaviors and without hesitation brought it to my attention and to the therapist's attention.... Again, without hesitation they alerted me and I was able to determine that this particular therapist was not in my son's best interest and I was empowered to make a change.

Had it not been for Mariposa and their willingness and openness to support my son, I was able to ensure that he was getting the therapy he needed that aligned with my values. LOOKING AHEAD: 2025 GOALS AND VISION

EXPANSION

Doug Dawson of McConnell and Robertson Architects worked with MFLC board members and leadership to create a conceptual design of a future Mariposa facility. This facility can serve up to 60 children at our current location with the hope that we can continue to operate from here: our current location is strategic in its proximity to Allison Elementary School and because it is located in a childcare desert where children and families are underserved.



MFLC continues to work with the City of Austin's Parks and Recreation Department and Economic Development Department, as well as elected officials, to ensuring a long-term lease of the property before moving forward with these plans. By early 2025, we aim to have an answer from the city about whether we can stay at our current location.

Thank you for the time and talent given to this effort, especially our Expansion Task Force, Doug Dawson, and the McConnell Robertson firm for creating this concept plan.

WHAT'S UP NEXT

- Take next steps to expand the facility and increase staff to serve up to 60 children
- Elevate education and skills development for children, parents, and teachers in 2025
- Continue providing healthy, whole-food snacks from the garden, dual language education, nature learning, and time spent outside to build strong bodies and problem-solving skills
- Expand meal services to include daily hot lunches, breakfast and snacks
